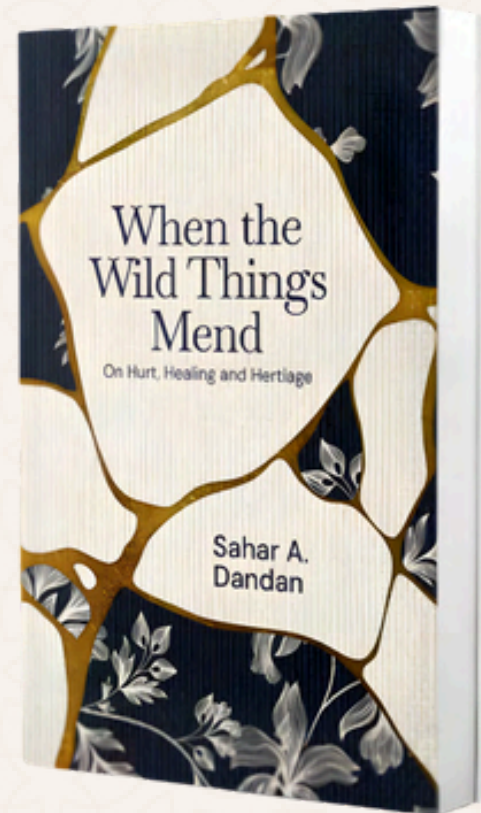

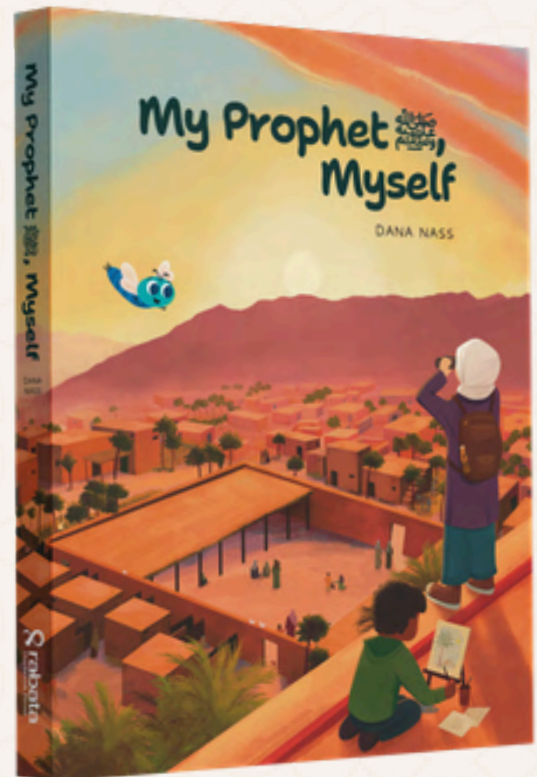
Journey into the character of the Prophet Muhammad ﷺ and become the best version of yourself!

Dr. Anse Anna-Maria built the Ribaati Arabic Program and continues to oversee this department. She has been teaching with Ribaati since its inception in 2013.

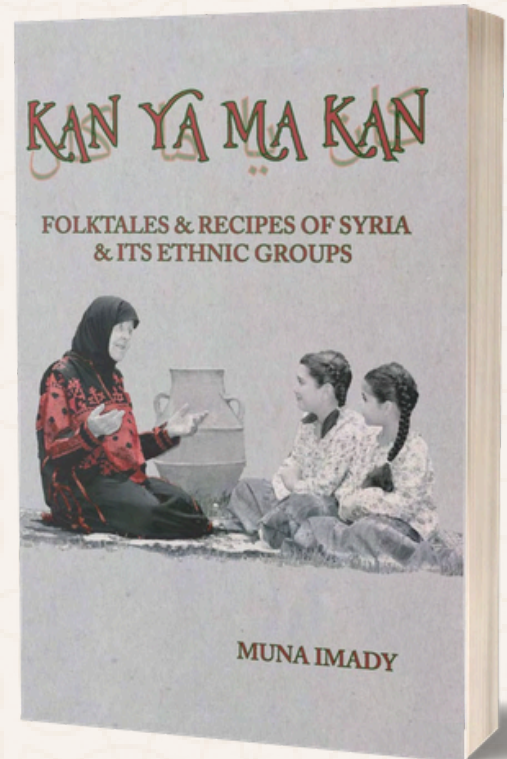

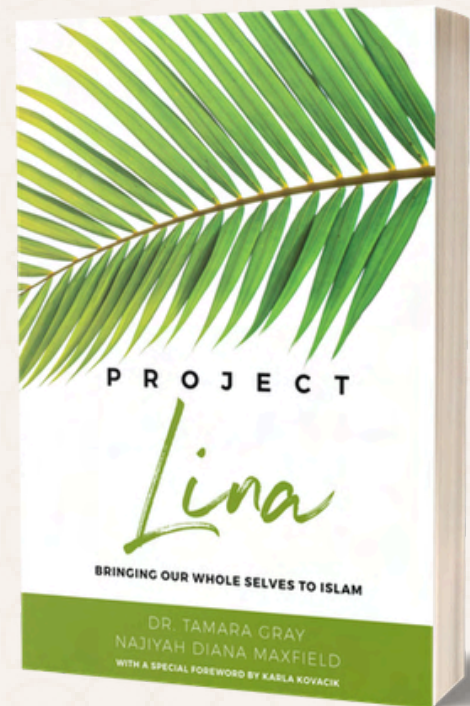
Nishat has taught both Arabic and tajwīd online extensively as well as in person. Nishat has been teaching Arabic with the Ribaat Academic Institute since 2014.

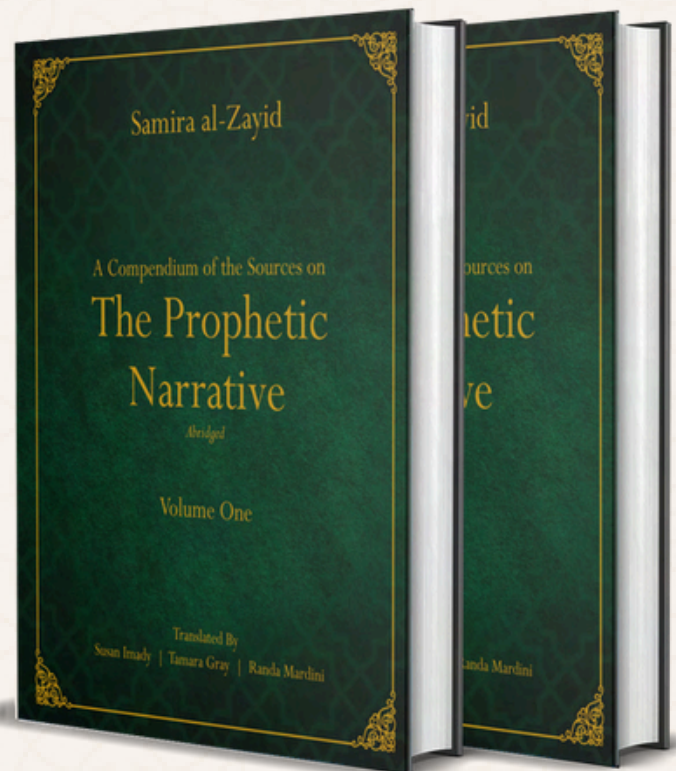
